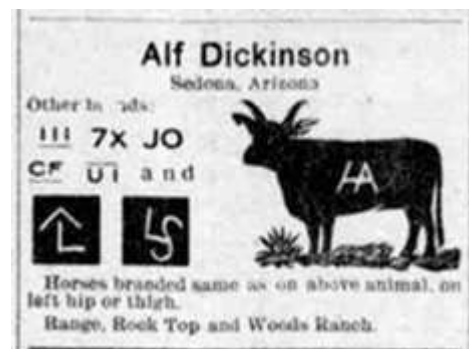

Alf was a member of a wagon train that left Humansville, Polk County, Missouri on 26 April 1875 and reached Wales Arnold's ranch near Montezuma Well in the Verde Valley on 23 August 1875. The train took three months and twenty days to reach Verde Valley, going through Kansas City, Emporia and Dodge City, Kansas, Colorado and New Mexico and continued west by the Old Star Mail route through Winslow and Holbrook, and on over a rocky trail which took them over the Mogollon Mountains, by way of Pine Springs, Stoneman's Lake then past Rattlesnake Tanks to the Verde Valley.

Alf was the owner of the Pine Hotel across the street from the train depot in Flagstaff, Arizona and a cattle rancher.
